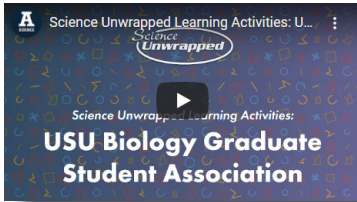


Making a Learning Activity Video for Science Unwrapped



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As we conduct the USU College of Science's **Science Unwrapped** public outreach program in a virtual environment, we welcome submissions of learning activity videos from volunteers. This is a great opportunity to continue to be involved in STEM outreach, while developing new skills. You can view examples of videos created by other individuals and groups at:

Interaction is the hallmark of Science Unwrapped, but since pandemic circumstances prevent our volunteers from conducting learning activities in person, we've turned to videos and the Web! We invite you to give this a try:

- You or members of your organization walk viewers through a short activity (topic of your choice).
- The video begins with a short description of required materials and ends with a description of your organization and your mission.
- Videos can be between 1 and 8 minutes long.
- Any resolution and video file format will work.
- You may submit text you would like added to your video in a separate file.
- We encourage you to practice social distancing and wear masks, if more than one person is in a video.
- Please name your video files and any additional text documents with your organization's name in the filename, such as "«Group»-video.mov" or "«Group»-description.docx".
- You may include your organization's logo, or a group photo, to be featured on the Science Unwrapped website. Examples of learning activity videos can be found on the Science Unwrapped website (We add the Science Unwrapped title page to each video.)
